## Dream Game Kicks Off Busy Week

The annual Lions Club Football Dream Game, the American Legion Region 5 baseball tournament and the Keystone Games all are scheduled to begin this week.

The Dream Game will be played Wednesday night in Scranton Memorial Stadium between all-stars from the City and County squads.

The two teams have been practicing for over a week and City coach Emil DeCantis and County coach Ray Ronchi feel they've moved the players around to the point where both have strong squads.

As with most all-star games, especially ones like the Dream Game where only graduated players are eligible, coaches can come up short at designated positions. This year it seems both teams were short offensive guards and some other linemen

had to be moved into those spots.

Kickoff is 8 p.m. and weather forecasts are for perfect conditions.

The City team includes players from Scranton Central, West Scranton, Scranton Tech, Scranton Prep, North Pocono, Dunmore and Bishop O'Hara.

The County squad has players from Old Forge, Riverside, Valley View, Mid-Valley, Lakeland, Abington Heights and Lackawanna Trail.

DeCantis will have the City team using a modified Scranton Central offense, while Ronchi said he hopes to open up the game with a variety of formations and plays for the County squad.
